Sale Day Medication Alert



Policy in Effect July 1, 2024

The Sale Day Medication Alert is a repository feature designed to streamline the process of disclosing medications given to sale horses after 6 p.m. on the day before they sell. This Asteris feature allows veterinarians to submit a Veterinary Certificate directly through a user friendly drag-and-drop interface.

Requirement for Disclosure of Medication

Please carefully consult Keeneland's Conditions of Sale for a complete list of medication rules, with special emphasis on Condition Thirteenth.

In order to treat a sales horse with a specific veterinary diagnosis, one (1) NSAID (restricted to Phenylbutazone, Flunixin Meglumine or Ketoprofen) at or below MRD may be administered to the horse <u>after 6pm the day prior to session in which horse is to be sold</u>, provided that a veterinary certificate disclosing the medication is submitted to Keeneland's repository by Consignor or Consignor's veterinarian.


The certificate must be on veterinarian's letterhead, and include:

- (1) Date, time and route of administration
- (2) Medication and dosage administered
- (3) Specific veterinary diagnosis for which the treatment was prescribed

If the certificate is submitted to the repository within 2 hours and/or 100 catalogued hips of the horse going through the ring, Keeneland may require it to be announced from the stand.

Submission

To submit a veterinary certificate disclosing medication, identify the horse in the Asteris Community portal and locate the Sale Day Medication Alert box. Drag-and-Drop the veterinary certificate to this box, or click browse to find and upload the PDF.



A PDF of the veterinary certificate will appear in the Consignor's Portal on the entries page, under "Attachments" (the same location as a Surgery Letter).

Viewing

Veterinarians who have viewed the subject horse's repository content prior to submission of the veterinary certificate disclosing medication will receive an email notification with a subject line reading 'MEDICATION ALERT: Notice...'.

The email will include a link to a PDF of the veterinary certificate that was submitted.

Horses that test positive for an NSAID due to a disclosed administration are not subject to return.
